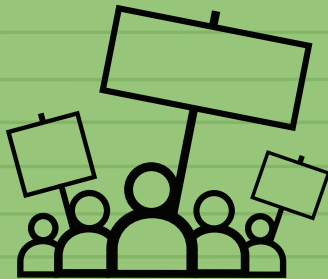


Appointed by the NJ Governor this diverse group helps to analyze and improve statewide systems and services.
