

Program looks to aid those with intellectual and developmental disabilities and mental health


Bobby Brier, NJ Spotlight

In 2021, Heather Margiotta started taking her adult daughter, Nicole, to the Rowan-Virtua Regional Integrated Special Needs Center in Sewell. Margiotta said she felt that a primary care doctor in Voorhees was not providing the proper care for her daughter, who is on the autism spectrum and also has schizoaffective disorder.

"I don't have to take her to see a psychologist here and a psychiatrist there and nobody's communicating with each other — where here. everything's under one roof," the Camden County resident said of the center in Sewell. "The doctors communicate with each other. It's just a fantastic setup that they have, especially for special needs."




