#### National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM)

October 2025 marks the 80th anniversary of National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM), which recognizes the positive impact people with disabilities have on the American workforce. In 1945, a weeklong national observance was established to recognize the contributions of people with physical disabilities. The NDEAM commemoration began in 1988, when Congress designated it as NDEAM, which then evolved to increase employment opportunities for people with disabilities, including those with mental health disorders and other nonobvious disabilities.


## Thinking for Me Comic
